





- 4) Robbery




# Uniform Crime Reporting Offense Data



\*Offenses are not specific to juveniles or adults and may or may not result in arrests



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


### UCR Definition of an Arrest

"The FBI's Uniform Crime Reporting (UCR) Program counts one arrest for each separate instance in which a person is arrested, cited, or summoned for an offense."










# Definition of a Youth Justice (YJ) Referral


A YJ Referral is a police report that has been referred to the County's District Attorney's Office for a charging decision.

































#### **2020** Youth Justice Referrals by Age by Gender




#### **2021** Youth Justice Referrals by Age by Gender




#### **2022 Youth Justice Referrals by Age by Gender**





















#### % of Referrals with an Automatic Formal Law Violation




#### % of Referrals with a Felony Law Violation






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







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















# Recidivism - Definition / Methodology used


Select the first Youth Justice (YJ) Referral for a unique youth in the prior year and look 6 and 12 months further to see if the same youth had another YJ Referral. If new YJ Referrals have occurred in a given timeframe (6 or 12 months), count as recidivism.

- Drop any instances where the youth had more than one referral from the same Law Enforcement Agency on the same day.
- Make sure the youth is still under YJ Jurisdiction (under age 17) and exclude those who are not from the analysis.







