Subcommittee members discussed several potential priorities for the Criminal Justice Council-Behavioral Health subcommittee moving forward. There are topics that need additional research before being pursued. Topics include:

- · Creation of a mental health court:
- Systematic process connecting and coordinating all service priorities on assessment and opportunities for justice-involved people living with mental illness;
- · Increased evaluation services at or prior jail booking;
- · Increased wraparound services on release;
- Diversion before entrance to a correctional facility;
- New location for emergency detentions:
- · Increased data capabilities;
- Peer support opportunities at criminal justice system touch points;
- Expedited competency restoration process; competency triage unit within the court system, or through collaboration with local hospitals

2. Behavioral Health Resource Center (BHRC) Update

Presented by Simon

The Behavioral Health Resource Center (BHRC) is receiving an increased number of calls. Many of these calls are from third-party callers asking for resources; many mothers are calling about adult sons. The vast majority of contacts are by phone. The website receives approximately 1,000 views per day. The highest utilization is on Mondays, Tuesdays, and Thursdays between 9am and 5pm. There is a need for substance use in-patient treatment for people who do not have insurance. Additionally, there are situations in which the court orders treatment, but people cannot afford to pay and then violate court orders. There are many additional barriers for people without insurance, particularly for finding psychiatrists and primary care providers; the BHRC is working with community organizations on this issue. It is also difficult to find mental health services for children under 10 years old. The BHRC has hired more case managers, including bilingual case managers. The BHRC will add more peer support specialists later this year. The BHRC is working on its data system, and will soon share a 6-month report.

DOC has recently implemented policy changes. The goal of the policy changes is to reduce revocations, reduce prison admissions related to revocations, and reduce the number of people in jail on a hold. DOC will use data to standardize rules and data entry of probationer rules for data tracking. The DOC will also use the Evidence Based Responses to Violations (EBRV) to categorize violations and risk factors, which will lead to consistent decision-making. There will be no substance use-related revocations. The sanctions have also changed, and the use of the alternatives to revocation program will focus only on probationers whose violations rise to the level of revocation.
