1. State Legislative Committee debrief - Bail and Pre-Trial

Legislative lobbyist for Dane County, Danielle Williams, discusses the legislative council study committee on bail/pretrial reform, and gives the CJC-Pretrial a timeline for potential action before the Legislative Branch. Discussion ensues around preventative detention, cash bail, and potential negative consequences on individuals.

The Legislative Council Study Committee on Bail and Conditions of Pretrial Release just released the following drafts.

- LRB-0850/1, relating to release of a person accused of a crime prior to conviction (first consideration).
- LRB-0852/P2, relating to pretrial detention.
- LRB-0864/P2, relating to bail jumping and providing a penalty.
- LRB-0866/P2, relating to bail jumping and providing a penalty.
- LRB-0923/P2, relating to the factors to consider when setting conditions for pretrial release.

2. Capstone Project

Clark-Bernhardt discusses the Capstone Project, as awarded to the Dane County CJC Research and Innovation Team by The Urban Institute. The project will allow us to integrate arrest and pretrial data –allowing for up to date answers to race, gender, age, offenses, and front end justice factors. It follows a request by Judge McNamara and Clark-Bernhardt for the Foundation to fund this work. Capstone Intern will likely be hired in December 2018. Deadline for integrated data is October 2019.
