E. Reports to Committee

1. Discussion of the APPR Community Conversation

Review of community conversation. McNamara, Frank-Loron, Esqueda were featured, and Clark-Bernhardt facilitated. There were 60 unique registrants who attended some or all of the meeting. Future conversations might focus on peer support in pretrial and opportunities for partnership with the courts. Discussion of constitutional amendment regarding cash bail.

2. Discussion of Research & Reports on Weekend Initial Appearance

Historically, there has been a lot of interest in weekend initial appearance. JFA research shows that weekend IA would likely decrease the jail by 10 people per weekend. Discussion of use of resources and fiscal impact. Resources would be required from the DA, law enforcement, public defender, and courts.

3. Planned Improvements in Local Pretrial

Discussion of transition between a decision-making framework (DMF) to a release conditions matrix (RCM). Advancing Pretrial Policy & Research (APPR) could assist with this transition. Interest in discussion and presentation to judges, court commissioners, and PSA assessors.

Pretrial Services also plans to incorporate peer support; existing funds will carry over in the future. Peer support is not currently used in many parts of the criminal justice system. Peer support is voluntary, not mandatory reporting.

4. 2022 OA-028 Discussion

Discussion of process for recruitment and review of new CJC members, as added by 2022 OA-28. Current CJC members are encouraged to share information about OA-28 with community members. New members will serve 2-year staggered terms.
