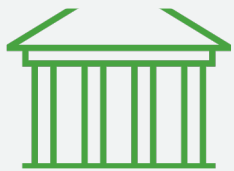

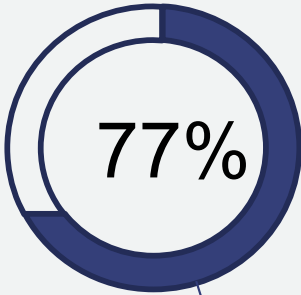

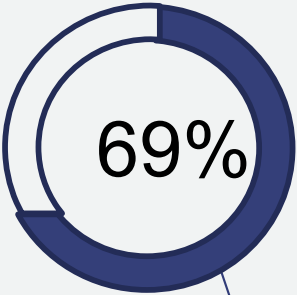


Promoting **Success** rather than Managing Failure

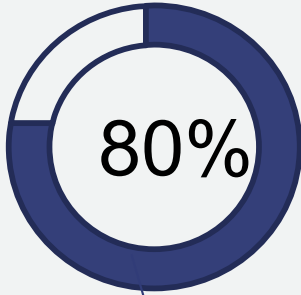
Data: Most People Succeed

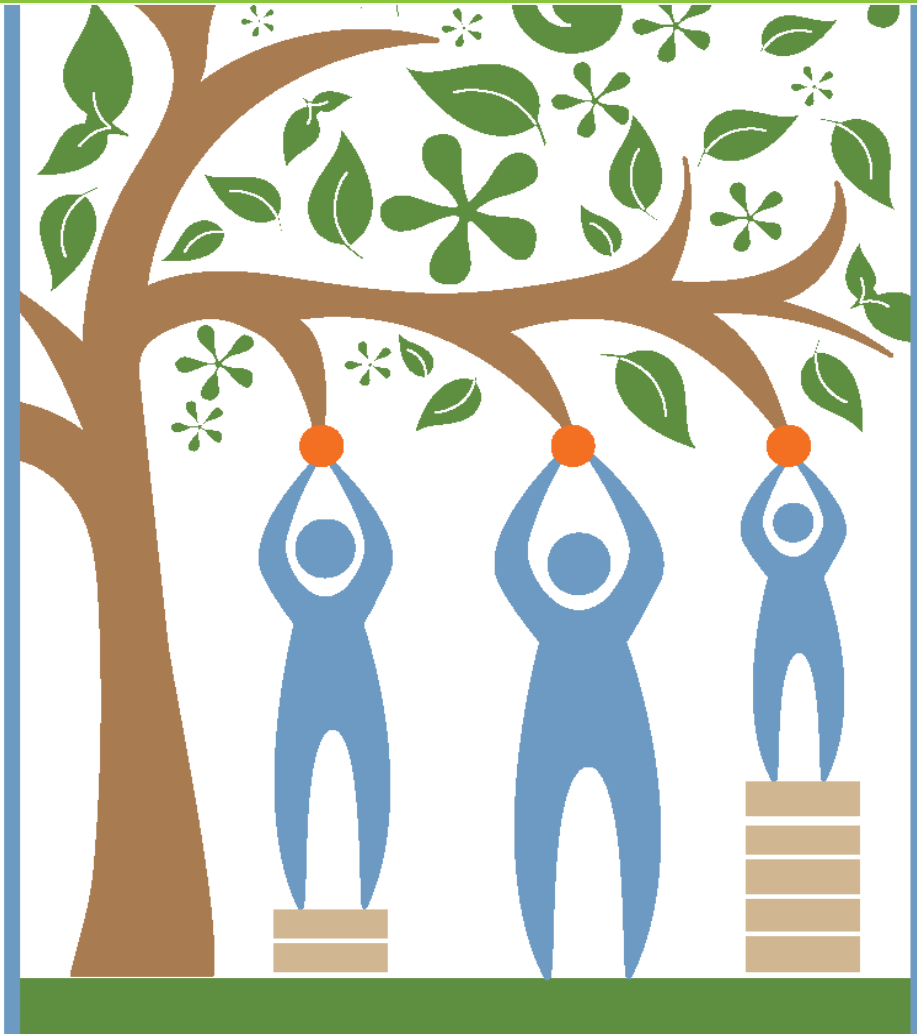

Research on Release Conditions

Release Condition	Research Findings
Court Date Notification	Much Support on court appearance
Pretrial Monitoring	Some Support on court appearance No Support on remaining arrest free
Alcohol or Drug Testing	No Support on court appearance No Support on remaining arrest free
Electronic Monitoring	Almost No Support
Financial Condition	No Support on court appearance No Support on remaining arrest free

Key Takeaway....

Vast majority of people on pretrial release appear in court and are not arrested on a new offense.
