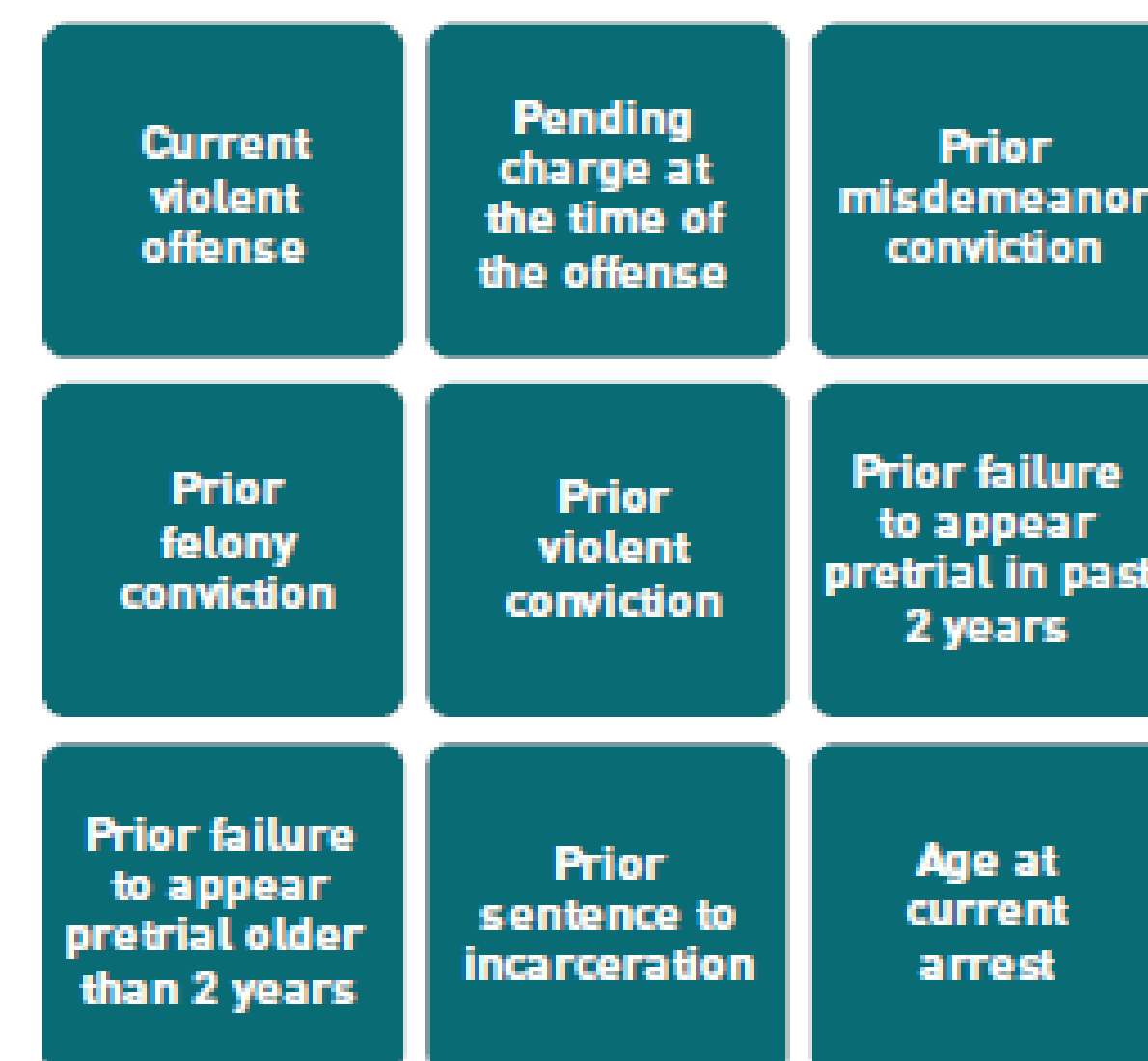

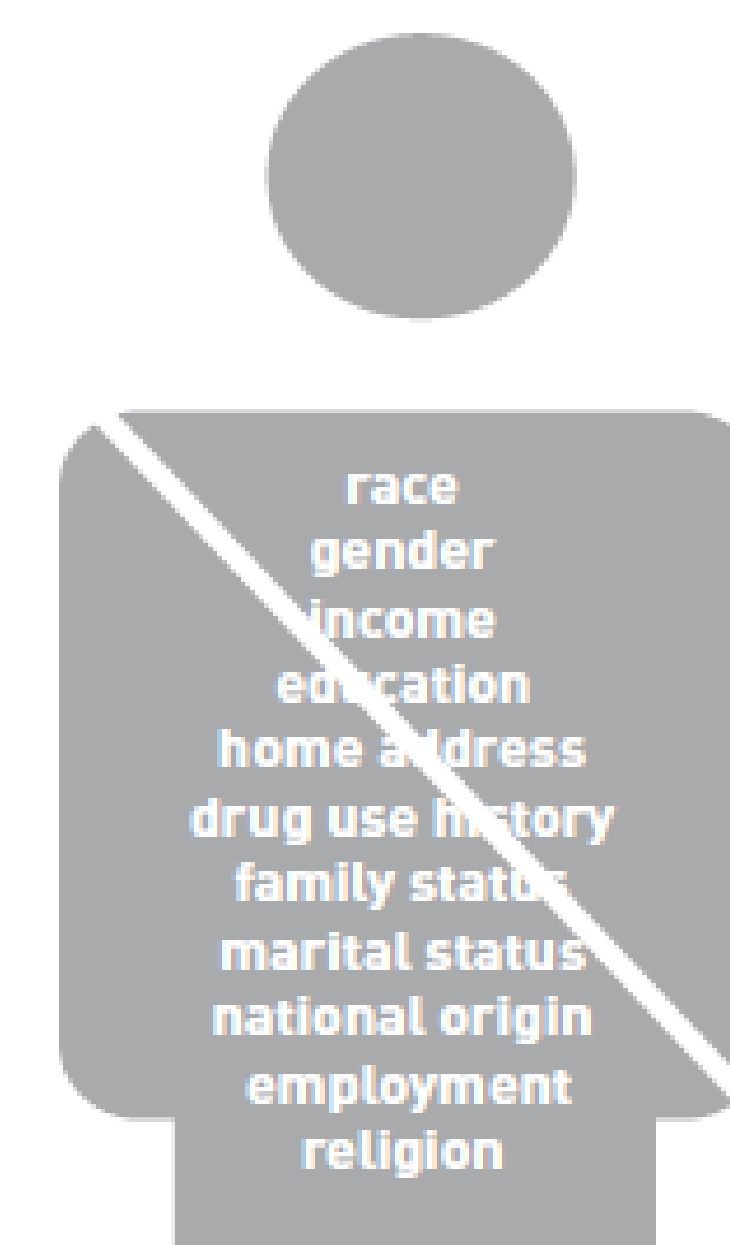
Since 2011 Dane County has utilized grant funding and County budgeted initiatives to focus on the following:



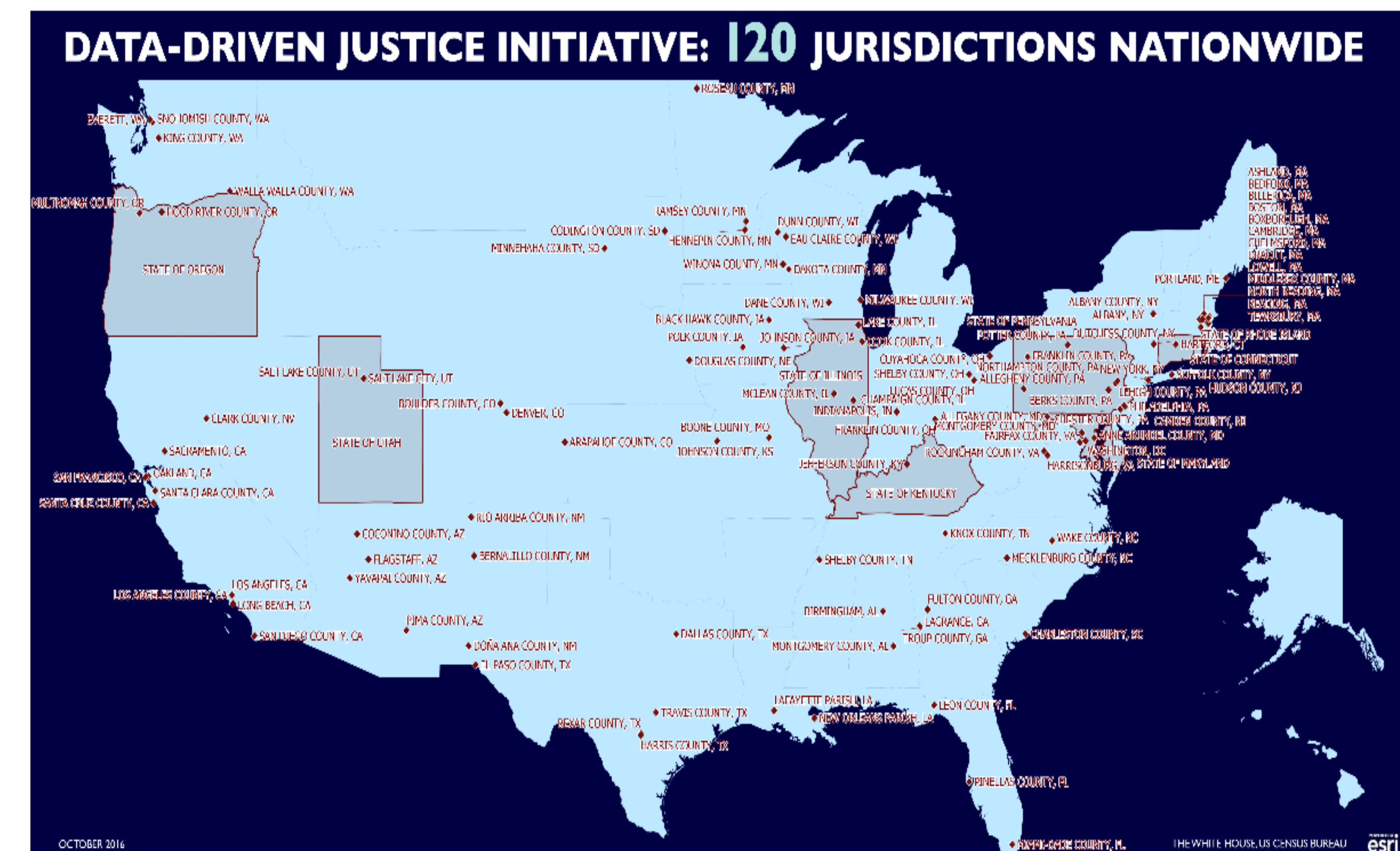
The PSA score is calculated based on nine factors.

KEY STRATEGIES

Strategy 1: Front End Diversion

- Dane County Community Restorative Court (CRC) offers pre-charge diversion to low level offenders. In 2017, it expanded from pilot phase to full implementation.
- Pre-Arrest Diversion Frameworks—The Role of Treatment in the Diversion Process. July 2017

Strategy 2: Pretrial Assessment

- In April 2017, Dane County began using the PSA (Public Safety Assessment) at initial appearance. The PSA provides information that is race- and gender-neutral. It helps guide pretrial decision making in an effort to increase safety, reduce taxpayer costs, and enhance fairness and efficiency in the system.

Strategy 3: Data Driven Justice

- Data Driven Justice (DDJ): Dane County joins a national cohort of jurisdictions dedicated to data driven justice.
- Dane County CJC Data Sharing Benchmarks developed and endorsed by CJC (June 2017).
- Data sharing agreement endorsed by criminal justice stakeholders to explore data integration of administrative data.

Strategy 4: Re-entry Strategies

- Window to work in DCSO
- Re-entry coordinator in DCSO
- Re-entry Court (pilot program currently being planned)
